Several activities related to Work Education, Health and Physical Education and Art Education for classes I to V have been included in the Academic Calendar. The teacher will implement these activities class wise during specific periods allotted in the daily routine.
(The teacher will complete these activities according to classes in a graded manner from simple to complex from August to December)

Activities related to Work Education

- Children will learn to make alphabet cards in English and Assamese.
- Children will make rulers, different kinds of envelopes and various dresses with the help of papers.
- Children will make clay dolls, utensils, boat, catapult, etc.

Activities related to Health and Physical Education

- The teacher will observe students' cleanliness.
- Children will practise throwing plastic balls.
- Children will stand on the tip of their toes and walk forward.
- Children will play games like musical chair, local folk games like sit-stand, one legged race, etc.
- Children will learn to do march past perfectly.
- Children will sit on the floor keeping the legs straight and try to touch the knees with the forehead.
- Children will learn long jump.
- Children will learn pranayam (Yoga).
- Children will learn 100 metres running race.
- Children will try to maintain balance by bending forward and lifting one leg backwards.
- Children will stand in a circle and do jogging like butterflies.
- Children will play local games.
- Arrangements will be made for all to wash hands before and after meals.

Activities related to Art Education

- Children will draw their favourite natural scenery, rural environment.
- Children will know the concept of musical instruments like dhol, khol, pepa, flute, etc. and use them in music.
- Children will try to dance folk/different forms of dance in groups.
- Children will act and deliver dialogues of various professionals in the society and also play roles or act or drama, stories in the textbook.
- Children will observe shape, size, colour of various objects inside and outside the class and draw.

Activities and Observation Days of the Month

5th September: Teachers' Day will be celebrated by offering floral tributes to Dr. Sarvapalli Radhakrishnan in front of his photograph and holding discussion on his life and philosophy. A cultural programme by students will mark the celebrations of the day.

8th September: Teacher will speak on the significance of International Literacy Day in the Morning Assembly. Children will write slogans, prepare placards on literacy and exhibit their work.

21st September: Discussions about the necessity of world peace in the existing society will be held during Morning Assembly and plans and programmes are to be taken up by the students for establishing peace in the society.

Several activities related to Work Education, Health and Physical Education and Art Education for classes VI to VIII have been included in the Academic Calendar. The teacher will implement these activities class wise during specific periods allotted in the daily routine.
(The teacher will complete these activities according to classes in a graded manner from simple to complex from August to December)

Activities related to Work Education

- Children will prepare wall magazine.
- Children will make essential things with the help of waste or unused things.
- Children will make banners, posters, slogan, etc.
- Children will plant trees in tubs.
- Children will plant various flowers, vegetables and learn to take care of them.
- Children will prepare charts, file covers, etc.
- Children will learn to fence a garden.
- Children will learn to prepare vermicompost.
- Children will learn the process to purify water domestically using stone, sand and coal.
- Children will learn to prepare albums by collecting various flowers, seeds and tree leaves.

Activities related to Health and Physical Education

- The teacher will observe students' cleanliness.
- Children will stretch their legs wide keeping their hands on their waists and bend forward and backward. They will repeat the exercise many times.
- Standing in a row and keeping their backs straight, children will go backward step by step (keeping the row straight).
- Keeping their backs straight, children will learn to sit in Sukhasana.
- Children will play Passing the ball.
- Children will do and repeat easy exercises for example, keeping hands up, keeping hands sideways or forward.
- Standing on one foot, children will maintain balance by spreading both their hands.
- Sitting on ground and stretching their legs, children will try to touch the ground with their head. Children will run 200 metres race.
- Arrangements will be made for all to wash hands before and after meals.

Activities related to Art Education

- Children will learn to sing Borgeet, Jyoti Sangeet, Rabha Sangeet, Bhupendra Sangeet, Borgeet, etc.
- Children will know about local musical instruments like dhol, khol, pepa, flute, sakti, gaganas etc. and learn to play them with songs.
- Based on their real life situation and their immediate environment observation, students will act on similar situations.
- Children will describe various events of the society through mimes.
- Children will sing and recite with action various rymes/poems from the textbooks.
- Children will play roles wearing masks.
